

## Primary and Secondary Title Field

The easiest way to read the Tree-of-Life pattern is the table format. You can get more tree patterns to a table. It is easier on our eyes to read columns and rows.

Of the two systems on this website, we will be studying OS 1. Although it is the more complex of the two, Option System 1 will provide more information on the operation of the tables. We will reference the Utah system when necessary.

The first table page includes the primary title field (see figure 1). In our example, this field reads, "OS 1 [options (op) 1, 1K, &22]". Subsequent pages will not have this primary field.

The abbreviated form for option or options is op. All tables will have this abbreviation to denote the option assigned to its particular table. Option System 1 consists of options 1 (group A), 1K (for group B), and 22 for (group C). As a reminder, group A begins with 1 Nephi 1 and goes to 2 Nephi 15:18. Group B starts from Jacob 1:1 and continues to Alma 16:261. Group C covers the last part of the Book of Mormon (Alma 17:1 to Moroni 10:31).

The secondary title fields head every table. On the far left, it gives the book and chapter of the first numbered verse of the table. In our example, this will be verse number 3 of 1 Nephi, chapter 1, since the Prototype (1 Nephi 1:1-2) does not apply to OS 1.

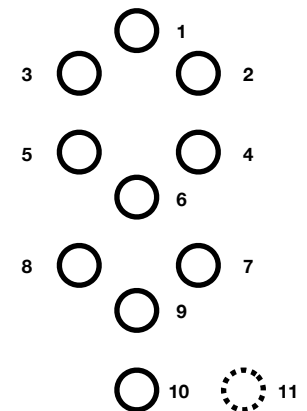


Figure 2 OS 1, page 18

Option 1 applies to this table (op 1). When the option changes from 1 to 1K, the notation will occur in this secondary field above the column involved. Page 18 of OS 1 (see figure 2) shows this change with additional reference to Jacob 1, the first book of 1K (and group B).

When a new chapter or book commences in one of the rows of a column, the secondary field reveals this adjustment. Scrolling through the pages of OS 1, the reader will see numerous examples. They will also observe the italicization of the first verse of new chapters.

The number of a verse that contains the world knowledge will have a bold and underlined type. In that table cell, cyan (sounds like Zion) will provide the background color. These verse numbers stand out in both OS 1 and Utah A.

In one particular case, a knowledge verse also begins a chapter in both OS 1 (Mosiah 6:1, page 25, see figure 3) and Utah A (Mosiah 9:1, page 16, see figure 4). Besides the bold and underlined type, italicization also identifies these chapters and verse numbers in their particular cells.

 Strength 5— yea, having had a great knowledge of the goodness and the mysteries of God,  
 Beauty 6— therefore I make a record of my proceedings in my days;  
 Victory 7— yea, I make a record in the language of my father,  
 Glory 8— which consists of the learning of the Jews and the language of the Egyptians.  
 Verse 2: Foundation 9— And I know the record which I make is true;  
 Kingdom 10— and I make it with mine own hand;  
 Knowledge 11— and I make it according to my **knowledge** (emphasis added)

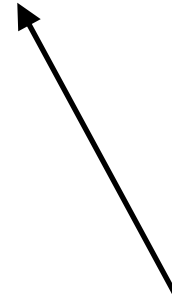
