## **Quick View**

Numbered verses make up the Book of Mormon. There are two major versions of the book--the Utah edition (LDS) and Missouri edition (RLDS). The verse arrangement differs for both.

These numbered verses also serve as codes, organized into tables as shown by clicking on buttons "Utah A" and "OS 1." Each example is called a system. Ten variations of these systems exist for the Utah edition and over a hundred for the Missouri version. They all are dissimilar on how they arrange the numbers. However, the last verse number for the Missouri edition will end on the 10th or 11th row of the table (for one example, see page 73 of OS 1). The ten systems of the Utah edition finishes on the 11th row only (see page 55 of Utah A for one illustration).

A few simple rules determine how these systems work. This website will introduce you to some of these rules, plus other information. Please check out "Utah A " and "OS 1" and the rest of the website.
