

Universe Within

When I look at the moon or the stars, I think of the Book of Mormon. Whether 8 or 9 planets orbit around our sun, I sometimes compare them to verses of that book rotating around the Son. For me, a universe exists within the Book of Mormon.

What if astronomers discovered a universe of 8,701 planets, each with an orbit (ring), revolving around one sun? What if these planets switched rings, without the spheres colliding into each other? Would the astronomers and scientists be intrigued by this discovery? Would they even care to investigate?

In a way, the Book of Mormon contains a solar system within the pages. Here are some similarities between the book and a solar system.

Solar System	=	Book of Mormon
Planet	=	Verse
Name of a Planet	=	Name of a Verse (1 Nephi 1:1, etc.)
Orbit	=	Sefirah
A Set of Orbits (8 or 9 planets with orbits, not the sun)	=	Tree of Life Pattern (10 sefirot, 11 with Knowledge sefirah)


Son--Jesus Christ

In this Update, we will further compare the universe of the heavens to the hidden one in the Book of Mormon.


Here is how I conceptualize this process.



God creates a small, empty planet.




God creates a #1. Crown sefirah in a Tree-of-Life Pattern.




He puts 1 Nephi 1:1 into the small, empty planet.


1 Nephi 1:1 I, Nephi, having been born of goodly parents, therefore I was taught somewhat in all the learning of my father; and having seen many afflictions in the course of my days -- nevertheless, having been highly favored of the Lord in all my days; yea, having had a great knowledge of the goodness and the mysteries of God, therefore I make a record of my proceedings in my days; yea, I make a record in the language of my father, which consists of the learning of the Jews and the language of the Egyptians.



The sefirah stretches into an orbit,
accompanied by the verse planet.



The crown orbit with the verse
planet goes around the sun/
Son—Jesus Christ.



Repeat this process 8,700 times—one
for each verse in the Missouri edition of
the Book of Mormon. Use only one sun/
Son. Add one knowledge orbit for each
set of 10 orbits (Tree-of-Life pattern) for
future adjustments.

The solar system consists of a sun and a set of planets with orbits.

The Book of Mormon contains verses (planets) and Tree-of-Life patterns (many sets of 10 or 11 orbits [sefirot]).

The planets gravitate around the sun orderly. The sun radiates out to the edges of the solar system.

The verses of the book have a divine orderly purpose. Jesus Christ radiates throughout the book.
